- II Should Daniel Philpott's assessment of the seeds of 911 and Sandra Barnes' perspective on terror, oil, and strategic philanthropy be accurate, refining the Triad parainstitutional organizational proposition based in part on the Simi Valley experiment and the work of Wheeler et.al. may be feasible.¹ Ms. Barnes' concern regarding corruption at all levels of crude extraction (in Africa) and a systemic power imbalance in the capital flow that produces and reproduces (African) poverty could be adjusted by the co-op tier of the Triad organization. It follows, then, that much of the capital required by the first tier can be recycled. A 4% operating budget feed from the first to the second tier would compare favorably with the 2.4% global defense budget/GDP ratio. The population evaluating these co-ops would need informed guidance and responsible networking to maximize benefits.
